

Doing Your Part

Reporting crime and suspicious activity is very important to keep crime out of your neighborhood. Report incidents to the Lancaster Sheriff's Station at 948-8466 and then talk to your neighbors about what is occurring.

Examples of incidents to report

- Someone screaming for help
- Someone looking into windows or into parked cars
- Unusual noises
- Property being taken out of closed businesses or houses where no one is home
- Suspicious vehicles moving slowly or driving without lights
- Anyone being forced into a vehicle
- A stranger sitting in a car or stopping to talk to a child

Reporting Crime

- Call 9-1-1 for emergencies or 948-8466 for non-emergencies
- Briefly describe the incident – what happened, when, where and who was involved
- Describe the suspect's gender, race, height, weight, hair color, clothing and distinctive characteristics such as any facial hair, scars or tattoos
- Describe the vehicle if one was involved; color, make and model, license plate or any distinguishing features such as dents, decals or missing parts like lights or bumpers

Neighborhood Watch brings the power of organization and the ability to focus energy and resources to your community.

Often Neighborhood Watch groups get started because there have been incidents in the community that have caused concern – acts of vandalism, burglaries or auto thefts. These are all the types of crime that Neighborhood Watch is most successful in reducing.

What is Neighborhood Watch?

Neighborhood Watch is a community-based program supported by the National Sheriff's Association. Since its inception in 1972, thousands of communities nationwide have established Neighborhood Watch in their neighborhoods and have made a REAL difference in public safety.

2. Arrange a kick-off meeting
3. Choose a Block Captain
4. Learn Neighborhood Watch basics and how to report crime and suspicious activity
5. Assess neighborhood needs and concerns
6. Build participation
7. Maintain energy and involvement
8. Celebrate with your neighbors by having a barbeque, holiday party or neighborhood clean-up

Staying Active

It's an unfortunate fact that when a neighborhood issue or crime goes away, so does the enthusiasm for Neighborhood Watch. The key to keeping a Neighborhood Watch group active over time is to maintain people's interest.

Adopt a long-term attitude from the start – the goal is to empower people to prevent crime, to form bonds among residents and law enforcement and to build a base for broader community improvement.
