INFORMATION FOR VOTE BY MAIL

Voted ballot must be received postmarked on or before Election Day, April 14, 2026 and **received by Elections Office no later than 8:00 pm on April 14,2026**

Note: If you place your voted ballot in the United States Postal Service or a bona fide private mail delivery company on or before April 14th, the ballot will be opened and tabulated as long as it is received by the Elections office no later than April 21st.

For this ALL Vote by Mail ballot election, your official ballot is included with this packet, **do not discard** it.

A postage paid Ballot Returned ID Envelope is included with your ballot. Following the directions below to ensure that your ballot is counted:

1. Check the "Ballot Return ID Envelope" to make sure your name is on it.
2. Place completed Official Ballot in the return envelope and seal it.
3. Sign the back of the Ballot Return Envelope. **If you do not sign the ballot return envelope, it does not count.**
4. Signature must match voter registration card. **If someone else signs your envelope, your ballot cannot be counted.** Signatures are verified with your voter registration and driver's license.
5. Print your name and Residential address; do not use a P.O. Box number.

You are now ready to return your Vote by Mail ballot via mail, in-person, or the ballot drop-off box locations listed on the back of your voter pamphlet! You **do not** have to add postage, it is pre-paid for you.

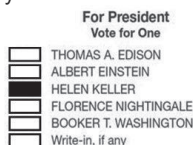
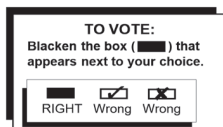

updates and ensure that taxpayer dollars are used exactly as voters intended.

I want to be clear: I am not attacking or accusing the current council of dishonesty or doing a poor job. I respect anyone who steps up to serve their community. My goal is simply to bring new ideas, fresh perspectives, and a renewed focus on affordability and accountability to the council. Lancaster is growing, and with growth comes the need for innovative approaches to fiscal responsibility and public trust.

I'm running because I believe in this community and in the power of honest, transparent leadership. With your support, we can build a city government that listens, acts responsibly, and puts residents first — because I believe, we are better together.

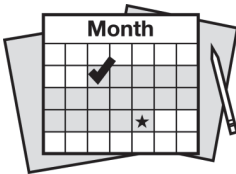
